HONOR CEREMONY- Ruby, Navy

Ruby, a West Virginia native, is on her Last Patrol. She joined the Navy in 1955 and became a Clerical Assistant, serving in the Navy Personnel Department. She has been married for 58 years. Last Patrol volunteers joined family to honor Ruby. As part of our honor ceremony, she was presented several patriotic gifts, a Certificate of Appreciation, and a Congressional Letter. HONOR CEREMONY - Albert, USMC

Last Patrol Volunteers in Maryland & Virginia honored Albert Willis who served his country in WWII, Korea, and Vietnam. He is a Montford Point Marine, the first Black Americans to be allowed in the Marines. He retired as a Sergeant Major after 23 years of service. He is a past commander of the 1st District of the American Legion Department of Pennsylvania and served as the Grand Marshall of Philadelphia's 2018 Veterans Day Parade.
