


**Cards of Gratitude Program**

Landy was born in 1932, in Richland, South Carolina. He served in the Korean War from 1951-1953. He was married to his wife for 66 years and has a son, 3 grandchildren, and 1 great grandchild.

HONOR CEREMONY - Gale, U.S. Navy -- "A few days too late."

Last Patrol volunteers were scheduled to honor Gale, a WWII Navy veteran. Sadly, Gale passed away just a few days prior to the planned ceremony. His family asked us to proceed anyway as we had prepared a beautiful medals case for him. Gale was born in 1924 in Colorado. He enlisted in the Navy in 1943 and was trained as a Sonarman. He was sent to Pearl Harbor, becoming a Sonar Instructor. Gale served on the USS Meade and USS Miles during the war. Both ships saw action in the Pacific. After the military, he worked for Union Carbide and was married for 57 years.



#### HONOR CEREMONY- Joe, U.S. Army

Last Patrol volunteers conducted an Honor Ceremony for Joe, an Army Veteran in hospice care. Joe was born in 1931. He enlisted in the Army and served from 1951 – 1953 in the 2nd Armored Division during the Cold War. After the military, Joe married and had 4 children. Joe remembers his time in service as a period of brotherhood and comradeship. "I was with good men," he explained about his military duty. "I'm proud I served."



HONOR CEREMONY - Ronald, U.S. Marine Corps

We honored Ronald, a Marine Vietnam vet in hospice care. Ron saw a lot of action in Vietnam with the 3<sup>rd</sup> Division. He served at Crabtree, Marble Mountain, and Khe Sanh. His shooting proficiency got him assigned later to a general officer's security detail. After military service, Ron and a small group of veterans formed a Ministry and Gospel Group in Hampton, VA. They traveled widely. "I wanted to keep serving," he said.
